he Pierre Fauchard Academy continues to advance leadership in Dentistry. Our online programs (at no cost to PFA Fellows) are being designed to advance the leadership skills of our Fellows. Our official publication, Dental Abstracts / Dental World, provides clinical and practice updates to improve your skills. Our hope is to identify and honor leaders and enhance their skills to make those leaders better. We rely on our Fellows to nominate other worthy candidates for Fellowship, and we ask you to share your ideas for future leadership programs. As an international dental honor organization, PFA Fellowship is one of the highest honors that a dentist may receive. The following information will describe the process used to become a Fellow in the PFA.

Selection for Fellowship is a tribute to past accomplishments and encouragement to future productivity. The honor of Fellowship is conferred on those dentists who have demonstrated that they have 'served' and/or have great potential for service and leadership. Fellowship is extended to fewer than 1% of dentists internationally and PFA Fellows are recognized as the best. We celebrate and honor the achievements of PFA Fellows. A potential Fellow must be nominated by a current Fellow of the PFA. The online nomination form is here: https://fauchard.wufoo.com/forms/sponsors-nomination-form/. When a nomination form is completed, the international office notifies the candidate and requests

that the candidate complete the online application. Completed applications are sent to the local Section Chair and Regional Trustee for review. Different PFA Sections conduct this review process in different ways. Most of our Sections have a local Board that reviews the application and then notifies the international office when the application is approved.

New Fellows are notified of their successful application by either the Section Chair or the international office. Our new Fellows must be inducted into the PFA through a formal induction meeting. New Fellows have the choice of being inducted at their local Section Meeting.

or at the PFA Gala (this year to be held on October 7, 2023, in Orlando). Fellowship in the PFA does not end with a certificate on the wall and a pin on your lapel. Our hope is that this Fellowship will serve as a catalyst for you to want to be, do, and give more of yourself in service to your family, profession, and community. Leadership and Volunteerism



# 2023 Grant Applications Accepted March 1 – June 1, 2023





The Oral Health Foundation of the Pierre Fauchard Academy will be accepting Grant Applications March 1 - June 1, 2023, for projects to be completed in 2024.

Since 1995, the Foundation has supported over 700 grants and \$5,200,000 towards helping hundreds of thousands of people worldwide. Grants are funded through generous donations received from Fellows and friends of the PFA, memorials, corporate and private sources.

Although the Foundation remains flexible enough to consider innovative projects in all areas of oral health, it does place special emphasis on programs that increase access and provide care to the deserving but inadequately served public. Emphasis for funding will be given to those worthy grants applications where the Foundation support will have the greatest impact on the success of the program supported by the grant.

Grants are awarded up to the following amounts:

- \$5,000 (US dollars) for Pierre Fauchard Academy Section programs under the Section's control and in which a significant number of Fellows participate.
  - \$10,000 (US dollars) for service projects that provide increased access to dental care for the public in need. Only non-profit 501(c)(3), tax-exempt organizations are eligible to receive Foundation funding.
